To Whom This May Concern,

With more High Performance programs starting in the province the SLA would like to reiterate that house programs **MUST** come first. For a player to be eligible to participate in these High Performance programs they must fulfill all obligations of their house league team as a priority to their High Performance team. This has always been the agreement that the SLA has made with these programs. The SLA will **NOT** give releases to individuals wanting to participate in these programs, parents who would like their children to participate in these programs must approach their own Association first and have them talk to the program they wish to play for. The Association, High Performance program, and parents must work out an agreement between all parties, once all parties agree on the conditions the home association will submit the agreement to the SLA, if no agreement can be made the player **MUST** play for his own association.

The SLA's main focus is grass roots development. The SLA is developing the foundation for both house leagues and high performance leagues within the province. These are being built to coexist and allow all players to develop within their community. The SLA will be rolling out these programs later this year with hopes of having them in place for the 2018 season
